Guidelines and Information for Scholarship

Scholarship funds are made available to persons who have registered or are planning to register in a Palliative Care home study or certificate program.

Grants are made for programs which have a direct application to palliative care.

Funds are designated for tuition and texts associated with the specified program.

Requests are not considered on a continuing or ongoing basis.

The fund is administered by a Committee of the Board of Directors. Ordinarily funds will be allocated on an annual basis.

The number of scholarships awarded in any year is based on the approved criteria and in relation to available funds.

Submission should be made in writing to the Fund by using the Scholarship Application Form provided. Please include any other pertinent material the applicant feels will help in the evaluation of the application.

The applicant will be advised in writing of the decision of the committee.

Criteria and Information for Award

The nominee

- * has a deep respect for the principles and values of palliative care mission and philosophy.
- * has made a particular contribution to the field of palliative care.
- * has provided leadership in the area of palliative care.
- * is recognized by one's peers as worthy to receive this award.

The Award

Honouring those who serve with compassion in palliative care, the award features a butterfly which celebrates the beauty of a life lived, and brings hope for new life.

It is presented annually at the Banquet of the Catholic Health Association Annual Convention in late October.

Nominations are made in writing to the Award Committee by returning the Nomination for Palliative Care Award form and other pertinent material in support of the nomination.

Nominations are received annually and considered in accordance with the stated criteria.

Nominations received up to September 30 will be considered in the current year.
